

Te Hikoi Museum in Riverton/Aparima, on the South Coast of Aotearoa New Zealand has a large and significant collection of artefacts from around the world, with a focus on Western Southland. The collection of more than 7,000 items is being digitised, and is available for anyone to view online by clicking on the eHive logo on <a href="https://www.tehikoi.co.nz">www.tehikoi.co.nz</a> \*\* eHive

We invite entries to our 2024 art challenge, of <u>any</u> creative works (e.g. paintings, photography, sculpture, creative writing, wearable art, music), inspired by <u>any</u> object in our collection.

This is a two stage entry process. Firstly, the entry form must be emailed as an expression of interest, so we can seek advice on cultural appropriateness of the use of the collection item. Secondly, completed works must be dropped off to Te Hikoi between 10am and 4pm, any day between 19-23 August 2024. Works must be accompanied by the entry form, completed by the creator. There is a limit of one work per creator, but more may be accepted at the discretion of Te Hikoi (e.g. a small series of pieces may count as one work). Sculpture maximum size 1m<sup>3</sup>.

Te Hikoi will select entries to be exhibited, along with some of the objects that inspired them, in an exhibition at Te Hikoi, to be held for the months of September and October 2023. Visitors will vote for a People's Choice award with an art supplies voucher of \$500 for the winner to spend at 'Art Supplies Southland' on Dee Street, Invercargill.
